
Judging Youth In Music 2021

Ed Argenziano

Ed holds a Bachelor of Science Degree in Music Ed. from William Paterson University, and a Masters of Arts Degree, Music Performance, from Montclair State University. He has performed with the New Jersey Percussion Ensemble, NJ Chamber Ensemble.

Ed has been a secondary school teacher in New Jersey for 28 years and is presently the Director of Instrumental Music/Orchestra at Morris Knolls HS in Rockaway. He is also on the faculty of Fairleigh Dickinson University Middle College.

In addition to numerous noteworthy performances throughout the country, Ed performed with NY City recording artists "Gabriel's Hold." Ed served as the North Jersey Area Honors Band President and Conductor. He also served as the New Jersey Allstate Percussion coordinator. Ed is extremely involved as a music/percussion clinician and music adjudicator and has toured extensively throughout the United States, Canada, Netherlands and Japan.

Mr. Argenziano served as Drum Corps International Percussion Caption administrator from 1997-1999, and Drum Corps Association Percussion administrator from 2001-2003. Ed was the percussion arranger/Show Designer for the 2004 "Magic of Orlando" DCI Drum and Bugle Corps show, and was the 2005 music/show consultant for the Colts Drum and Bugle Corps, as well as the percussion designer and arranger for the New York Skyliners. He was a member of the Hawthorne Muchachos from 1973 to 1976, and was a member of the Hawthorne Caballeros 1977 to 1979. In addition, Ed served as percussion instructor for the 1982 & 1983 Bayonne Bridgemen. Mr. Argenziano has judged numerous music events for Drum Corps International, Drum Corps Japan, Bands Of America and Winter Guard International. He has numerous commissions for percussion arrangements and compositions throughout the world with published works exclusively with Row-Loff Productions, Nashville, TN.



Jeff Ausdemore

Jeff Ausdemore serves as President and Co-Founder of Stryvemind.com, a revolutionary online music education platform that impacts students and educators around the world. This venture serves student musicians, music educators and administrators in many capacities, including a world class private lesson faculty, educational consulting, as well as the Stryve Academy.

Prior, Mr. Ausdemore was the Director of Music at Grapevine-Colleyville's iUniversity Prep. In this expanded role, Mr. Ausdemore oversaw all music curricula, including music theory, music history, music composition/arranging, as well as applied music for all primary and secondary level students. In addition, Mr. Ausdemore created the iMusic Club, a club dedicated to enriching the lives of all students enrolled at iUniversity Prep. Prior to this post, Mr. Ausdemore served eleven years as the Director of Percussion Studies at Colleyville Heritage High School. In this role, Mr. Ausdemore served as the percussion coordinator, head of jazz studies, and co-director/composer/arranger of the Colleyville Heritage marching band. The CHHS percussion program enjoyed national notoriety, including gold medals in the NTCA Indoor Circuit, PAS Marching Percussion titles, the PAS "Call for Tapes" winners, the PAS Small Ensemble Champions, as well as multiple Lone Star and Plano Drum Line marching percussion titles.


Prior to his appointment to CHHS, Mr. Ausdemore taught at the University of Texas Arlington as adjunct professor of percussion, serving as the percussion arranger/assistant director of the UTA Marching Band, teaching percussion pedagogy/techniques classes, assisting the UTA percussion ensemble, and maintaining a full private studio as well.

Mr. Ausdemore has composed/arranged, instructed and consulted with numerous high school and college marching bands throughout the US. In addition, Ausdemore has worked with Drum Corps International ensembles including the Cavaliers, Phantom Regiment, Limited Edition, Northern Aurora, Southwind, and the Blue Knights Drum and Bugle Corps. During Mr. Ausdemore's tenure at the Blue Knights, the percussion program produced several percussion individual solo championships, percussion ensemble championships, and a strong reputation for excellence, placing in the elite "top 12" in the Drum Corps International Championships consistently.

As a composer, Mr. Ausdemore has contributed original works for piano, instrumental guitar, contemporary multimedia, percussion and choir, percussion solo instruments, percussion ensemble, as well as wind ensemble and marching band. Several ensembles have commissioned and premiered Mr. Ausdemore's works on recordings and live concerts, including the Music for All national festival, the Interlochen Fine Arts Academy summer camp, as well as the upcoming 2021 Midwest Clinic.

Mr. Ausdemore's professional affiliations include adjudication roles for Drum Corps International, Winter Guard International, Bands of America, a marching percussion committee member for the Percussive Arts Society, the Texas Music Educator's Association, the Texas Bandmasters Association, and the American Society of Composers, Authors, and Publishers, and currently serves as the current Vice President of Percussion and Winds on the executive board of the North Texas Color Guard Association.

Jeff Ausdemore is proud to endorse and serve as an artist clinician for Dynasty Musical Instruments, Zildjian cymbals, Remo drumheads and Pro Mark sticks and mallets.



Steve Citta

Steve Citta is the former Director of Bands at Waterloo West High School in Waterloo, Iowa. His marching bands, jazz bands and wind ensembles earned numerous honors and awards in the twenty years that he was at West High. In 2015 he was awarded the Philip Sehmann Excellence in Teaching Award by the Northeast Iowa Bandmasters. He retired in 2017 after teaching in Iowa for 34 years. Mr. Citta is a professional music arranger, designer, drill writer and works extensively throughout the Midwest as a clinician and adjudicator. He has presented marching band clinics and seminars at the Iowa Bandmasters Convention, the Iowa Music Educators Association Conference and continues to work as an arranger and visual consultant for many bands throughout Iowa. Steve is an adjudicator for the Tri-State Judging Association, the Iowa High School Music Association and has judged the Heritage Festival in Chicago, the Fiesta Bowl National Band Championship in Phoenix, AZ and the NMSU Tournament of Bands in Las Cruces, NM. Steve Citta holds a

Bachelor of Music Education Degree from the University of Northern Iowa and graduate hours from Illinois State University, Iowa State University, University of Iowa and the University of Northern Iowa. Steve and his wife Mary live in Cedar Falls, Iowa.



Brian Hadley

Brian Hadley has taught band and orchestra in the Minneapolis Public School district since 1997 and currently teaches band at Olson Middle School. To further his musical training, he performs in various local community bands and orchestras including the Minnesota Philharmonic Orchestra where he has been principal bassoon since 2000 and served for many years on their Board of Directors. He also performs regularly with the Praise Team at All Gods' Children Metropolitan Church. Mr. Hadley had a Bachelor of Music in Music Education from the University of Minnesota where he studied bassoon with John Miller and Charles Ullery and Saxophone with Ruben Haugen.

Brian has also been performing, teaching or judging in the marching band/drum corps/color guard activity for more than 30 years. Brian currently judges for the North Star Circuit and even served for six years as Chief Judge. He has instructed several Minnesota high school, college marching bands as well as with Minnesota

Brass, Inc. Drum and Bugle Corps. Brian lives in Richfield with his two cats Roger and Stewie.



Ward Miller

Ward Miller grew up in Loachapoka, a small farming community near the city of Auburn, Alabama. He earned his bachelors of music education from Auburn University in 2001, where he served as webmaster, arranger, and an undergraduate teaching assistant with the Auburn University Marching Band. He graduated from Arizona State University in 2003 with a masters in Trombone Performance. While in the Phoenix area, he served as a part time assistant and clinician with the Paradise Valley High School bands, the Mesa Community College Wind Ensemble, and the Phoenix Symphony Guild Youth Orchestra. He taught public school in Alabama for three years, serving as Director of Bands at Andalusia and Pleasant Grove High Schools. In 2006 he accepted a graduate teaching assistantship at The University of Iowa, where he studied with Dr. Myron Welch in Band Conducting. While at Iowa, he also worked as a teaching assistant with the Hawkeye Marching Band, where he wrote, taught, and conducted multiple arrangements and halftime drills.

He also conducted the Iowa University Concert Band, as well as the Southeast Iowa Concert Band at Iowa Wes-Ieyan University. He earned the 2008 outstanding Graduate Teaching Assistant award for the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences. Dr. Miller graduated in 2011 from the University of Iowa with his D.M.A. in Band Conducting.

From 2008 through 2013, Dr. Miller was the Associate Director of Bands and Director of Athletic Bands at the University of South Alabama, in Mobile. While at South Alabama, Dr. Miller founded to 230-member Jaguar Marching Band, overseeing all recruiting, teaching, and writing for the band. In addition, he directed the basketball pep bands. His teaching duties included Marching Band Techniques, Brass Methods, Trombone Quartet, Symphony Band (the second concert ensemble, auditioned and approximately 65% music majors), and undergraduate conducting. He also guest conducted the Wind Ensemble, the school's top instrumental concert ensemble.

Dr. Miller served as the Musical Arranger, Drill Writer, and Assistant Director of the Macy's Great American Marching Band in New York City from 2006 through 2018. He was the director of the All-Star Band at the 100th annual Cherry Blossom Parade in Washington, D.C. He has appeared as a guest conductor and clinician to multiple concert honor bands throughout the United States. His marching band arrangements have been performed at competitions, including in Bands of America regionals, by high schools and colleges across the country, as well as the annual Rose Parade in Pasadena, CA. His arrangements have been performed at regular season and bowl games by the marching bands at Auburn University, Emory and Henry College, The University of Hawaii, The University of Illinois, The University of Iowa, The University of Kentucky, The University of Louisville, The Ohio State University, and Youngstown State University. He has served as an adjudicator at marching and concert band assessments in Alabama, Georgia, Illinois, Kentucky, Minnesota, Mississippi, New York, and Wisconsin.

Since 2018, Dr. Miller has served as the Education Director for Youth in Music, a Minneapolis based nonprofit organization that hosts marching band events and clinics throughout the upper Midwest.

From 2014 through 2019, Dr. Miller served as the Brass Caption Head for the World Class Blue Stars Drum and Bugle Corps of La Crosse, WI. Every year under his leadership, the hornline has placed in the top 12 and made finals. The hornline achieved "Box 5" scores in the regular season and in finals in the 2017-2019 seasons. In 2018 and 2019, the hornline and drum corps placed in the top 8. He oversaw the brass ensemble and staff, recruited for the horn line, and administered the Blue Stars brass audition camps throughout the country. In addition, he traveled with the corps for the majority of their tour. In addition to his work with the Blue Stars, Dr. Miller has also served as the

Brass Arranger and an instructional consultant for Minnesota Brass. He currently arranges for the Louisiana Stars Drum and Bugle Corps.

Dr. Miller is nationally certified by the National Federation of State High School Associations to adjudicate musical events. His arrangements and compositions have been published by the DevMusic Company, and he is a published composer with the Tuba-Euphonium Press. He has had articles published in the Alabreve (Alabama's state music education journal), the Illinois State Music Educators Journal, the Journal of Band Research, as well as regular articles in School Band and Orchestra Magazine. He is an associate member of College Band Directors National Association (CBDNA), the National Association for Music Education (NAfME), and the American Society of Composers, Authors, and Publishers (ASCAP). He holds memberships in Pi Kappa Lamba national honorary music society, and Golden Key national honorary society. He currently resides in Minneapolis, MN where he spends his time arranging and composing, and working as a music education consultant clinicing and judging bands.



Hieu Nguyen

Hieu Nguyen is originally from Danbury, CT. He first became involved in the marching arts as a tenor saxophone player in his high school marching band. From there, he began in the colorguard activity by joining his high school winter guard and found a great love for the activitywhich continues till this day. Since then, Hieu has performed with many successful groups including: Alter Ego, St. John's of Beverly, and St. Ann's World Winterguards. He has also performed in DCI with the Cadets. Hieu began his extensive movement training at Boston University where he was a member of the dance theatre group. He focused his training in ballet, modern, and hip hop movement. During law school, he expanded his training to contemporary movement and earned a role in the Anna Myer contemporary dance company from Cambridge, MA where he performed professionally for several years. Hieu has shared his passion in the activity by teaching and choreographing for several successful units. Currently, Hieu is on staff at Shenendehowa High School as a

choreographer where he has been since 2009. Hieu began adjudicating in 2006 and is a current WGI and DCI adjudicator.

Outside of the activity, Hieu is an Attorney running his own law practice in Boston, MA specializing in family law and domestic violence prevention. He has been named a top 40 Attorney under 40 in the State for 4 consecutive years and remains committed to giving back to the community by volunteering at Greater Boston Legal Services for those in need. Hieu is also an avid runner and is a proud finisher of the 2012, 2013, and 2014 Boston Marathons for team Boston Arts Academy raising over \$14,000 for Arts based education. In 2013 and 2016 Hieu completed the NYC and Chicago Marathons raising over \$4,000 for the WGI Scholarship fund. After having some fun running, Hieu is currently focusing on his competitive Brazilian Jujitsu.



Andy Schmidt

Andy Schmidt is the Director of Sales & Operations for GrandTours Inc., a music performance travel provider based in St. Paul, MN. Prior to his position with Grand-Tours, Mr. Schmidt spent 21 years as the 7th and 8th grade band director at Highview Middle School in the Mounds View school district in New Brighton, MN. In addition to his classroom responsibilities Mr. Schmidt worked as an instructional coach at Highview, summer band coordinator for the school district and the District Music Coordinator. Under Mr. Schmidt's leadership, the Highview 8th Grade Band was invited to perform at the Minnesota Music Educators Association's Midwinter Clinic in 2011 and the Mounds View Public Schools had been selected by NAMM as a Best Community for Music Education for seven consecutive years.

Mr. Schmidt holds a Bachelor of Music degree in Music Education from the University of Minnesota and a Masters of Arts degree in Curriculum and Instruction from the University of St. Thomas.

Mr. Schmidt continues to be actively involved in the marching community in Minnesota. He has served as a designer, instructor, consultant or guest clinician for several award-winning marching bands, drum corps, colorguards and drumlines in Minnesota and throughout the upper Midwest. Mr. Schmidt is also an active adjudicator for field shows, parades, winter colorguard and winter drumline competitions across the country. He is a member of the Tri-State Judges Association, North Star Judges Guild and Minnesota Percussion Association. Andy and his wife Megan live in Shoreview, MN with their two children, Jacob and Haley.



Todd Snead

Todd Snead is CEO of Phantom Regiment, Inc., a non-profit youth performing arts organization based in Loves Park, IL. He holds a Ph.D. in Teaching and Learning and most recently served as the interim Director of Lyric Unlimited (the department devoted to education and community engagement) at Lyric Opera of Chicago.

Dr. Snead's career began as Assistant Director of Bands at Judson High School in Converse, TX. He then performed professionally with the award-winning musical Blast! which led to his involvement in the drum corps activity. Dr. Snead served as Executive Director of Spirit of Atlanta from 2011-2013. Prior to that appointment, Dr. Snead was the Brass Co-Caption Head at Spirit and was a brass instructor at the Madison Scouts and Glassmen drum and bugle corps. Dr. Snead served on the Board of Directors for the Cavaliers Drum and Bugle Corps in 2017 and was inducted into the Spirit of Atlanta Hall of Fame in 2021.

Dr. Snead has fulfilled a wide range of leadership roles in the arts education community. He was Assistant Professor of Music Education at the University of Minnesota, Twin Cities; served as Director of Learning Programs at Lyric Opera, Education Manager at The Atlanta Opera, Education Coordinator at The Phoenix Symphony, and Site Coordinator for the Sound Learning Program (a music education partnership between the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra and Georgia State University). Dr. Snead has been a clinician and adjudicator throughout much of the United States and is published in *Music Educators Journal and Teaching Music*.



Chad Armbruster

Since joining the Madison Junior Scouts Drum and Bugle Corps in 1994, Chad Armbruster has enjoyed his involvement as a performer, instructor, director and adjudicator for marching bands, indoor drumlines, colorguards and drum and bugle corps throughout the country.

Armbruster holds a Bachelor's Degree in Music Education from the University of Minnesota in the Twin Cities and a Masters of Arts in Education Degree from Hamline University. He currently serves as Director of Bands at Richfield High School in Richfield, Minnesota. Armbruster previously directed public school music programs at Monticello HS, St. Francis HS, Champlin Park HS and Hastings HS in Hastings, Nebraska. His experience as a music department leader and curriculum specialist, led to his invitation to serve the Minnesota Department of Education as a member of the 2018 Academic Arts Standards review committee.

Armbruster is active as a clinician, adjudicator and consultant for marching arts programs throughout the country. He has held a variety of leadership and teaching positions with the following organizations and schools: Youth In Music, Minnesota Brass, Inc., Southwind, Blue Stars, Madison Scouts, Spirit of Atlanta, Eastview High School, Anoka High School and Henry Sibley High School. He serves as the Head Judge and Judge Coordinator for Youth In Music, as an adjudicator for Tri-State Judges Association, WSMA, Northstar Colorguard Circuit, Minnesota Percussion Association and Drum Corps International, most recently being invited to judge the 2019 Drum Corps International Open Class World Championships. Chad Armbruster lives in Minneapolis with his wife Ellen and their son Walter.

The Farmington High School Band Program is a comprehensive instrumental music education program serving over 300 students. Comprising four concert bands, three jazz ensembles, competitive marching band, pep band, solo/ensemble contest, winter percussion, and many other small ensembles, FHS band students collaborate with professional conductors, composers, and college ensembles on a regular basis.

The concert ensembles are the nucleus of Farmington High School's band program. Based on grade level and/or audition results, FHS students participate in two Varsity Bands, Concert Band, Symphonic Band, and Wind Ensemble. The FHS Concert Bands are top-tier ensembles that qualify several students each year for prestigious programs like the Minnesota All-State Band and Orchestra program.

The jazz program is a hallmark of FHS and the greater Farmington community - the largest curricular jazz program in Minnesota. FHS jazz ensembles have been selected for the most prestigious performances, including appearances at the Minnesota Music Educators Midwinter Clinic and Carnegie Hall. As a curricular class, all four Jazz Bands meet daily throughout the school year, the largest program of its kind in the state of Minnesota. The jazz ensembles perform in four formal concerts annually, participate in several regional festivals, and play regularly for community and social events.

The Farmington Tiger Marching Band has been a staple of football games and area parades for decades, but also began competing in field marching festivals in 2014. After only three years of competition, the Farmington Tiger Marching Band took 4th Place in the 2016 Minnesota Class A Marching Band Championships. By 2019, the Marching Band had risen to the rank of 2nd Place in Class AA. In the winter season, the FHS Pep Band is one of the most exciting groups around, playing regularly for varsity hockey and basketball teams.

In the fall of 2020, Farmington High School also introduced its first project-based instrumental music courses, two sections of Rock Band, an exploratory music course for students interested in guitar, bass, drums, keyboards, and vocals. Rock Band is a course in which students learn to arrange, write, and perform music of their favorite popular genres, including - but not limited to - rock, R&B, country, pop, and more. It will incorporate a variety of both acoustic and electric musical elements and styles, and is designed for students without formal music or musical notation experience. In the fall of 2021, the bands will offer another semester elective in cooperation with the social studies department, "Hamilton: History & Music." With approximately 20% of FHS students currently taking a music course, we look forward to presenting opportunities for all students to find personal and artistic expression without any musical prerequisite.

The FHS Bands are directed by Erin Holmes, who has been teaching music in the Farmington School District since 2000; Bradley Mariska, who joined the FHS team in 2016; and Elliot Douma, who began his tenure in 2020.
